walk on level ground, and lift no more than a couple of pounds. That really put a damper on the Christmas activities. The heart specialist said he needed at least one valve replaced. He finally went in for surgery Jan. 18 in Petoskey, and we expected him to be home in a few days, but when they opened him up, they found more complications. His aorta had a 4-inch aneurism, and his heart itself was about twice normal size, because it had to work overtime compensating for the bad valve. What should have been 4 or 5 hour surgery took 11 hours, and they couldn't get the heart to pump on its own. They decided to send him to U of M medical center in Ann Arbor.
